1.	<p>Hazard COVID-19</p> <p>Risk</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stress due to recent lockdown period and partial academy closure – causing prolonged period away from the Academy experiencing isolation in their home increased anxiety around leaving their home and returning to the academy 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All staff have completed the Judicium stress management training prior to returning to work. Staff members have increased self-awareness reducing the chance of them projecting negative feelings or personal anxieties onto the students. All staff have completed Trauma Informed Schools UK training Part 1. Senior staff have completed 2-day TISUK course, SEND and Inclusion staff completed mindfulness training. This has created increased staff awareness and understanding about the students' perspective of the impact of the COVID-19 situation on their holistic health and well-being. Strategies to be used when students experience stress or anxiety for prolonged periods of time have been provided – time to talk to staff from the Inclusion Team, providing a safe and secure environment to students who feel anxious and need to talk in private. Students who access counselling / Life-Coach sessions - discussing returning to the Academy, any concerns shared by students DSL informed and additional support in place – certain key staff available on their timetabled days. Letters sent to student/parent/carer explaining September start, induction session to outline the timetable and safety precautions students are required to follow. Information about how the Academy is managing the COVID- 19 situation has been shared with students during staff induction. Refer to the COVID-19 Risk Assessment. Information about student wellbeing to support mental health has been shared with students. 	LOW	X

There are posters explaining how to safely wear and remove a face mask. Students will follow the appropriate procedure for putting on and using a plastic bag for removing the face mask. Students who are unwell or who are isolating will not attend the academy – attendance and isolation log is kept. No students will be allowed on site if they display COVID 19 symptoms. Parent/carer will be contacted to inform them about the symptoms. The student will be kept in isolation until they are able to go home. Staff wear a face visor in communal areas or when interacting with students in different bubbles. Isolation period implemented once student is identified to have been or in company of a person showing symptoms of COVID 19. 	LOW	X

Critical for the Academy to ensure good communication with families - phone calls to be returned promptly and notes recorded on Bromcom. 13.	<p>Hazard: • COVID 19.</p> <p>Risk:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Contact with virus during the working day, balanced with the need for students to have some down time from teaching and use toilets. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The students have staggered start, finish, break and lunch times assigned to the course pathway to reduce contact between students in different bubbles. Students can access the recreation area for fresh air, during break and lunch time sessions. The break and lunch sessions are staggered and supervised. Students will be encouraged to use toilets during their allocated break and lunchtime in accordance with the 'bubble'. Students should maintain social distance when using toilet facilities and stay on the teaching floors assigned to their 'bubble'. Teachers can alert the duty principal by email if a student requires support. Students are provided with access to handwashing facilities: soap paper hand towels and sanitiser. Increased hygiene and cleaning regime employed in these areas. 	LOW	X

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All students are required to stay on site during school day, the staggered start and end times will help to reduce congestion on public transport and reduce the risk of COVID 19 transmission at the Academy. • Additional cleaning in toilets, dining, classrooms and other areas required during the day. • Tape has been used to mark out areas where social distancing is required, including waiting areas where one student is permitted at a time e.g. attendance office. • Clear signage on the walls and floors to remind students about one system on floors B-E and to keep distance on floor A.
